Child Safe Standards Accreditation Package

The Royal Commission into Institutional Child Abuse has identified the importance for all organisations that have any contact with children or young people, either directly or indirectly need to demonstrate a child safe environment. The only way that an organisation can keep children safe and prevent child abuse and neglect is to ensure each and every member of the organisation understands their requirements and the organisations.

In Safe Hands Educators in Safety has produced a new product to support services through these new changes.

7 Steps 2 Safety Accreditation – Child Safe Organisation Package is an accreditation process for 12 months which includes:

1. Complete review and amendments of child protection policy and procedures

The *In Safe Hands Educators in Safety* team will conduct a review of the service's child protection policy and procedure and make recommendations of changes. These preferred amendments will be provided in a draft document for acceptance. Critical Incident and Child Safety Investigation & Management Service

In Safe Hands Educators in Safety can support organisations in internal investigations into allegations made against staff involving child safe practices or concerns. This includes interviewing informants, witnesses, staff and children to compile an internal report. Other services include compiling a communication strategy to protect the organisation through these complaints.

Expertise in Interviewing Children

In Safe Hands Educators in Safety understand the emotional and psychological harm children can experience when they are a victim or a witness in relation to a traumatic event or incident. It is important that children are protected and interviewed fairly during this time.

With our experience in interviewing children we now provide an interviewing service for any matter where a child's version of events is required.

Legal Requirements

Evidence: With formal training and studies in law, and experience in investigative and interviewing processes, we are conversant with rules of evidence.

Continuity of evidence: All statements will be obtained by digital video and audio means unless otherwise requested. Original digital recordings will saved in a secured main frame establishment with all original recordings having detailed reports on any editing, copying or enhancing. Unless otherwise stipulated in contract only two copies of the original digital recording will be provided to legal representatives. Once copy will be marked for court production, the other will be an investigative copy. Once delivered the security and continued continuity of evidence is the responsibility of the legal service taking possession of the copies.

Confidentiality of material: All material will be personally delivered or sent by registered post. Detailed exhibit register will be maintained. Main frame holding of original material is secured with extensive security settings. *In Safe Hands Educators In Safety* will not save any other versions of any digital recordings other than on this secured main frame.

Destruction of material: Once the two copies of any digital recording are provided to the client *In Safe Hands Educator in Safety* waive their duty of care in regard to the destruction of these two copies. This duty of care and destruction is the responsibility of the client.

Original digital recording will be permanently deleted from *In Safe Hands Educators In Safety* secured main frame on receipt of written request of the client or by court order.

Confirmation letter will be provided for records when this process has been undertaken by *In Safe Hands Educators In Safety*.

Affidavits: Affidavits or statements will be provided in the format requested by the client or clients legal representation.

Interviewing Process

Process: The following is some or all of the processes undertaken as part of the service:

- Review of any incident, or history provided by client prior to interviewing child.
- Development of an interview plan.
- Requests and review of any material requested on the child being interviewed.
- Digital recording of interview/s with child. More than one maybe required dependent on rapport building and ice breaking strategies. At the discretion of the interviewer and at no further cost to client.
- Detailed affidavit or report on interview undertaken.

Full Disclosure: To maintain independence during the process, the interviewer will provide full disclosure of any material (including verbal) provided about the case or child, whether hearsay information or not, from any client or party directly or indirectly involved, within any affidavit or statement provided by the interviewer.

Report on interview: As soon as practicable after the interview with the child has been conducted a report will be provided to the client outlining the fact the interview has been undertaken and whether any relevant disclosures or information was provided. This report will not outline any precise of the information provided by the child, only to identify to the client whether any relevant information will be forth coming from the completion of the interview.

About the Interviewer

Michael Pecic has 26 years' experience in child protection case management, investigation and education. He served with distinction as a Detective with the Queensland Police Service for 20 years investigating child abuse offences. Key highlights of his investigative career include:

- Earning the Assistant Commissioner's Award for dedication to child protection.
- Interviewing over 1000 children as victims, witnesses and offenders in serious criminal investigations including murder, rape and child abuse offences.
- Head facilitator of the Queensland Police Service Child Protection Course for six years, training plain clothes officers in investigation and interviewing principals and techniques for child abuse investigations.
- Developed the first Nationally Accredited Child Protection Course (Juvenile Aid Bureau Course) for the Queensland Police Service.
- Chief Investigator for the Queensland Police Service into the death of a baby in care "Baby Kate". Key recommendations of this investigation included the review of the Government and non-government multi agency response to child protection management. These recommendations forced an Ombudsmen investigation and subsequent "Baby Kate" report which resulted in numerous positive changes for multiagency responses to child abuse concerns in Queensland.
- For 10 years he was a core member of various SCAN teams (Suspected Child Abuse and Neglect multiagency team) case managing the most serious of child protection issues.

Michael has also served as the Chief Inspector for the Royal Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Queensland (RSPCA) for 4 years where he worked closely at an executive level with Government Departments in regard to legislation and community expectations.

He has dedicated the last 10 years to education and awareness of child protection issues. He has formal qualifications in management, training, investigation practices and public safety. Michael is a Churchill Fellow and a member of the International Society for the Prevention of Child Abuse and Neglect.
